

Q Why are Sunday Masses during Easter Time sometimes known as the Masses for neophytes?



A The heart of the Period of

Postbaptismal Catechesis or Mystagogy, the fourth stage of Christian initiation, is the seven Sundays following Easter and ending on Pentecost. They span fifty days, which the Church has long described as one great day of celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. We honor and guide neophytes by reserving a place for them in the assembly during these liturgies. With alleluias, Scripture accounts of post-Resurrection appearances of the Lord, the Apostles' proclamation of Christ to the world, and the Eucharistic banquet, these Masses are ideal settings for neophytes to explore and experience their new faith.


