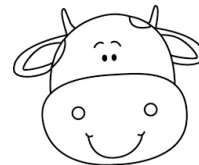

FACTS

- Diapers are expensive, and a healthy child will wear an average of 50 diapers a week.
- Safety net programs like WIC and SNAP (Food Stamps) do not cover the cost of diapers.
- Parents in low-income households often must try to make due by stretching their supply by leaving babies in dirty diapers longer or by reusing diapers.
- Not having diapers means parents can't leave their children with a childcare provider, most of which require parents to provide disposable diapers for their children.

DIAPER DRIVE

- For many babies having a clean, dry diaper is a luxury.

Each day low-income families in our community and throughout Cascade County struggle to keep their babies' bottoms covered.
- Diaper drives make a difference. With clean, dry diapers babies are emotionally and physically healthier. And moms and dads are less stressed and better able to carry out other important parenting duties.
- In 2017, St. Vincent de Paul gave more than 50,000 diapers to families in need.
- We are in need of all sizes of diapers and wipes.
- The diaper drive ends July 1st, 2018.

Why does the grieving process last so long?

It is often difficult for the family, friends, and colleagues of a loved one to understand why the grieving process lasts so long. They want to see us happy again and getting on with our life. It is important to be aware of the many kinds of levels of loss than can accompany the death of a loved one. This awareness may help us and others who care about us to be more patient and gentle to us and to others during the grieving process.

Secondary losses that come with loss of a loved one:

a part of ourselves, identity, self-confidence, a chosen lifestyle,
security
