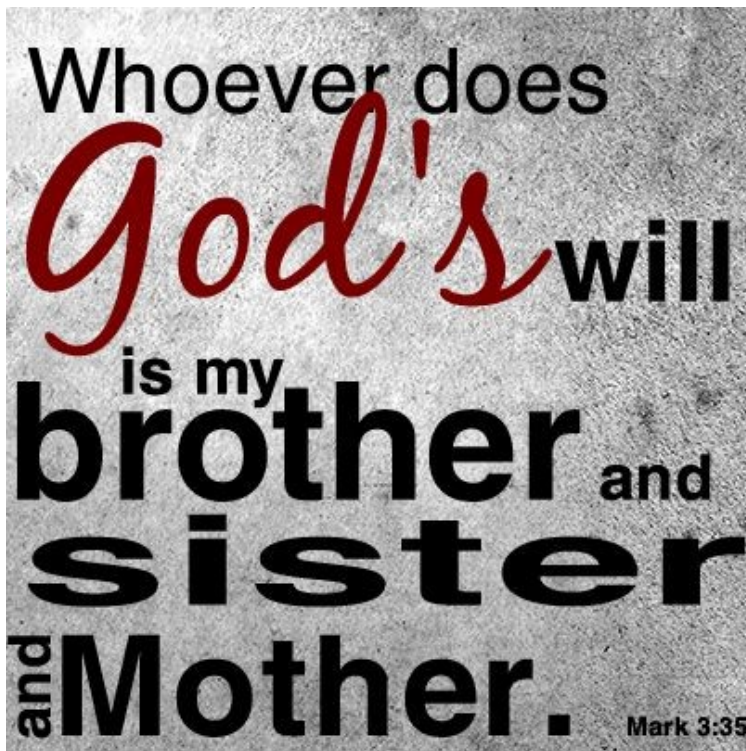

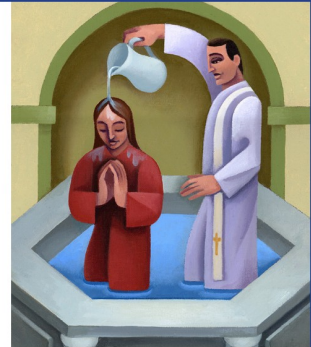

Where can I learn about being
"more Christian"?

Q What is Christian initiation?

A Christian initiation is the process of preparing for and receiving the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Those baptized as infants receive these sacraments over years—Eucharist at around the age of seven, and Confirmation anywhere between seven and sixteen. But in the ancient Church, these sacraments were received together. That still happens for adults who wish to become Christians. Their preparation may last one or more years; they learn about and apprentice in a life of faith in the community before receiving all three sacraments at once, usually at the Easter Vigil, on the night before Easter. This process is known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Adults baptized in other Christian traditions prepare to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. Depending on their background, this preparation may take a few or many months.
