

## Know the 10 SIGNS

# Holy Spirit Parish Nurse Health Tips Alzheimers

 Memory loss that disrupts daily life – early stages forgetting recently learned information, Asking same questions over and over; forgetting important dates.

(Typical Age Changes: Sometimes forgetting but remembers them later.)

- Challenges in planning or solving problems difficulty concentrating and taking longer to do tasks. Changes in their
- ability to work with numbers. (Typical Age Changes: occasional errors balancing a checkbook)
- Difficulty completing familiar tasks driving to familiar place, remembering rules or keeping track of checkbook. (Typical Age Changes: needing some help operating electronic devices.)
- Confusion with time or place lose track of dates, seasons, and time passage. Forget where they
  are or how they got there. (Typical Age Changes: Confusion about day of week but figures it out
  later.)
- Trouble understanding visual images and spatial relationships Difficulty reading, judging
  distance, and determining color or contrast may cause difficulty driving. May not understand
  they are the one they are seeing in the mirror. (Typical Age Changes: Vision changes related to
  cataracts or eye diseases.)
- New problems with words in speaking or writing trouble following conversations, have no idea
  how to continue and may repeat themselves or call things by the wrong names. (Typical Age
  Changes: Sometimes having trouble finding the right word.)
- Misplacing things and losing the ability to retrace steps. may put things in unusual places and
  are unable to go back to find them again. May accuse others of stealing. This occurs more
  frequently over time. (Typical Age Changes: Misplace things from time to time and are able to
  retrace steps to find them.)
- Decreased or poor judgement changes in decision making and judgement. Less attention to grooming and unable to handle money efficiently. (Typical Age Changes: Making a bad decision once in a while.)
- Withdrawal from work or social activities start removing themselves from hobbies, social
  activities, work projects or sports. Possibly because of the changes they have experienced.
  (Typical Age Changes: Sometimes feeling weary of work, family and social obligations.)
- Changes in mood and personality easily upset when out of their comfort zone, can become
  confused, suspicious, depressed, fearful or anxious. (Typical Age Changes: Developing very
  specific ways of doing things and becoming irritable when a routine is disrupted.)

If you notice any of the 10 warning signs of Alzheimer's in yourself or someone you know, don't ignore them. Please consult your physician.

- 2 Practice compassion forgive yourself and others when expectations are not met.
- 3 Let go of the need for perfection.
- 4 Be honest differentiate between "have to" and "need to"
- 5 Don't be afraid to try something new.
- 6 Honor tradition and remember those who have gone before us.
- 7 Be thankful for your blessings each day.
- 8 Ask for help when needed and help others (many hands lighten the load).
- 9 Smile (it may be the best gift someone receives).
- 10 Material things come and go, what is in our heart stays forever.

## From the desk of Father Silvester, HGN

## History of Divine Mercy Province

"Heralds of Good News" (HGN) is a Clerical Missionary Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right, whose principal seat is established in the diocese of Eluru in India, was founded by Rev Fr. Jose Kaimlett on October 14, 1984. It was erected as of diocesan right on May 5, 1991 and being recognized as of Pontifical right on May 5, 1999. The Society has a charism that is unique to itself of training and supplying zealous and saintly priests wherever there is need in the universal Church, especially due to the shortage of local vocations. The Society has Mary Queen of Apostles and St. Joseph the Worker as the Patrons. Since the Society has made a rapid progress both in the matter of personnel and at the level of activities, to make a smooth run of the administration, four new Provinces were created in August 2008, namely; Mary Queen of Apostles Province, St. Paul Province, St. John Paul-II Province and Blessed Mother Teresa Province. In September 2017 a new province has been created and the name of the new province is Divine Mercy Province. All the five provinces now function under the leadership of five different "Provincials", and the whole Society is guided by the "Superior General". The official inauguration of the Divine Mercy Province of Heralds of Good News was held on 29<sup>th</sup> October2017 at HASCOM, Poonamalee, Chennai, India

During the weekend of November 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, Fr. Joy, Superior General of Divine Mercy Province will be visiting Holy Spirit Parish to share more about the mission of Heralds of Good News. Fr. Joy and I will be making an appeal for the Order-Heralds of Good News- to help support their mission of forming seminarians for pastoral work in dioceses in India and abroad. There are currently 120 priests from Heralds of Good News serving in 32 dioceses in 24 states in the United States. We have established a Non-Profit in Alabama, US. (All donors will receive a tax donation receipt).
