Family Promise is a place where we do not give up on people! 4 years ago, Holy Spirit became the 1st of 11 churches in Great Falls to host the 1st family in Family Promise. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve the needs of our homeless children through the Monsignor House. Families who come to us are an interesting mix of what it means to be a family. We have heads of families who are Moms/Dads/Grandparent/Step Grandparent/Uncle/Auntie/ Sister/Brother. These families seek a better way to live, want to grow in skills that help them to go in another direction, and long to move from the limited lifestyle that pulls them back into the poverty. Many reasons cause people to be in dire straits and in need of people to be there for them. For us in Family Promise we long to help these children by lending their guardians a helping hand. Our simple approach to the complex issue of poverty works for those who: 1) want to work a program; 2) want to leave poverty behind; 3) willing to take a chance with people they do not know; 4) willing to move weekly from 1 church to another; 5) willing to stay the course in seeking a home; 6) willing to learn new skills needed for change and 7) willing to trust in a process. For those who have graduated from the Family Promise program they are doing well and continue to stay in touch with the Family Promise Center (Hub). They have become our friends and we have become theirs.

Our next hosting for Family Promise Holy Spirit is February 3-10. We host at the Monsignor House at 2810 Central. To learn more about what you can do in Family Promise Holy Spirit, give Kathie Malby a call at 781-5033. She will return your call as soon as she can.


