



church to answer questions or help you sign up to help with the Family Promise Program which we host out of the Monsignor House

As we enter into the Ordinary Time of the Church Year, we begin, once again, to learn how to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Isaiah gives a prophecy, in poetic form, a foretelling of a person to come who will show us how to manifest God's light. We are called to become like the Lord who shows forth the living God, by opening the eyes of the blind, bringing justice to the oppressed, and lighting the way for those in physical, emotional and spiritual darkness. In Family Promise we are able to help to alleviate some of the darkness that fear brings, assist those who are struggling to see in a new way, and remove the sense of hopelessness that homelessness causes, with families, who find themselves floundering because of the turn their homelife has taken.

In January 2015 Holy Spirit Church was the 1st of 13 churches to begin the rotation of hosting families who are homeless. We host the families at the Monsignor Joseph Gluszek Hospitality House located at 2810 Central Avenue. As coordinators for the program & caretakers of the Monsignor House, we have made volunteering in the House & for the Program as simple as we can. We keep the volunteer time to a minimum so no one is taxed with the issue of time. There are 6 areas for volunteering that ALWAYS need help. They are:

Cleaning House (1.15 hours 4 times a year)

Spring Cleaning Yard & House (2 hours -- 1 time a year)

Bring in OR Take out cots which are delivered to & from the House at the beginning of the week or at the end of the week (.5 hour 4 times a year)

Donation of foods for Family Promise program (4 times a year)

Laundry (4 times a year)

*Bringing in prepared suppers & staying to provide hospitality during supper

(1.5 hours 4 times a year)

*Staying overnight as hosts from Holy Spirit (10-12 hours 4 times a year)

*The National directives for the Family Promise Program requires 2 people at a time to be at the House during direct contact with families. That does not include the on-site coordinator.

To volunteer in the Family Promise program a 1.5 hour training is provided, by the Executive Director, DJ Lott, to give an overall understanding of the program for all volunteers in all the churches that provide temporary housing & board for the homeless families.
