



# FREE THROW CHAMPIONS ANNOUNCEMENT

Since 1972, councils have sponsored the *Knights of Columbus Free*Throw Championship for boys and girls from the ages of 9 to 14 to provide an athletic outlet and encourage the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. Kids compete within their own gender and age and progress from local council- level to district, and state competitions.

Three boys and three girls from the local area were named Council and District-level champions of the **2020 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship** and have earned the right to advance to the state level competition.

Mother of Perpetual Help, Council #9395 sponsored the council-level competition held on January 25<sup>th</sup> at the GF Central Catholic High School gymnasium. All youth ages 9 to 14 were eligible to participate.

Nine-year-old champions were **Lucy Donnelly**, a student from Holy Spirit Catholic School, in the girls' bracket and **Jayden Alatorre** from Cascade, MT in the boys' bracket.

Tara Donnelly, also attending Holy Spirit Catholic School was named the ten-year-old girls' champion.

Maddie Boggs earned first place in the girl's eleven year-old with Connor Hallahan also a student at Holy Spirit Catholic School capturing the top spot for the boy's eleven- year-old group.

The fourteen-year-old champion in the boy's bracket was **Hunter Goad**, a student attending North Middle School.

Named winners were awarded a trophy and a Champion certificate in recognition of their superb achievement in this event. All participants in this competition were presented with a Certificate of Participation and given a gift card good towards a cool treat at a local ice cream shop.

Congratulations to each of them and "good luck' at state-level. A huge "THANKS" to all parents, guardians, parish and school staff members that supported this event and made it a great success.
