Statement by the Catholic Bishops of Montana on the '20 **Ballot Proposals to Legalize Recreational Marijuana**

The Roman Catholic Bishops of Montana oppose the legalization of recreational marijuana as a threat to the flourishing of individual persons—particularly, the young, the poor, and those who struggle with either substance abuse or mental health challenges.

We pray for those whose lives have been scarred by the scourge of substance abuse and join with state leaders in business, transportation, medicine and law enforcement in urging voters to reject marijuana legalization and vote "NO" on 1-190 and CI-118.

Please remember these protocols when you are in Holy Spirit Parish building:

PLEASE:

- Wear a mask inside the building. You may take your mask off when going to receive Communion.
- Practice physical distancing. Sit 6 feet from your neighbors in the pews and stay 6 feet apart in the Communion line.
