



Stewardship

Reflection: This is our last weekend in Ordinary Time until we begin hearing from St. Mark's Good News again in June. We will pick up his theme of the Kingdom of God, after the Lenten and Easter seasons.



The emphasis in the readings this weekend is about leprosy; leprosy in the Scriptures has a different meaning that the Hansen's disease that modern medicine treats with antibiotics. In ancient times, communicable disease was dealt with by separating people from the community. The decision to keep people with skin conditions outside the community helped the community to stay 'clean' or 'whole' and/or 'pure.' How hard it was for the one's who suffered these infirmities in those days!

The humility of the leper in Mark's gospel touches the heart of Jesus and he reaches out to heal him. In doing so, Jesus has to stay 'outside' the community in order to avoid the popularity status given to him as a healer. The Kingdom of God is available to everyone, even those with issues that could keep them unclean. Through Jesus, the miracles He extends to the marginalized folks, makes them 'pure' and they can return to the community from which they were exiled. As amazing as the miracles were 2000 years ago, today we would find the healings from Jesus just as startling and shocking. We are challenged to do the work of Jesus for the sake of the Kingdom and to draw into it all the vulnerable, lonely, isolated and hurting people today. We have the compassionate hearts that reflect the response of Jesus to the leper: *I do will it. Be made clean.* How are we called to 'make clean' the people in our own inner circles?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Faith.

The Associated Press recently issued a report, printed in a number of local newspapers, on dioceses who were beneficiaries of the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) within the Catholic Church in the US. The PPP provided grants intended to keep small businesses and nonprofits afloat amid the Covid-19 pandemic. This program included churches of all Christian denominations and other religious groups as potential recipients. The PPP was written specifically to include all these religious groups knowing that many had numerous employees who would likely be laid off. According to the report, "112 dioceses that shared their financial statements, along with the churches and schools they oversee, collected at least \$1.5 billion in taxpayer-backed aid"—despite "sitting on well over \$10 billion in cash, short-term investments or other available funds."

The authors of the report obviously do not appreciate the diversity of the Catholic Church and how it is structured, let alone to the many good works and dedicated employees the PPP money is supporting. The authors of the report also do not appreciate that each diocese is financially independent. Some obviously are in a strong financial position. Many mission dioceses, like the Diocese of Great Falls-Billings, are not in a strong financial position. Many of our parishes as well are small and financially struggle. While each diocese (i.e., a local church) is united with all other dioceses in faith, our legal structure makes each of us independent from each other. The Diocese of Great Falls-Billings is a 501 c 3 corporation legally under the Roman Catholic Bishop of Great Falls. Our parish financial assets are held in trust under a separate corporation (also a 501 c 3 c), the Capital Assets Support Corporation.

The Diocese of Great Falls-Billings Chancery applied for the PPP loan in May 2020. We applied for the loan based on 10 weeks of payroll for the diocesan chancery staff, the cemeteries, and 10 small parishes that we facilitate their payroll. Many of our other parishes in our diocese who run their own payroll also applied for and received their own PPP loan. During this time, we were required to suspend Mass and other pastoral services which essentially closed down parishes and our chancery office. Given that the Church operates mostly on philanthropy, this and other dioceses became financial insecure overnight, but we continued to pay all our employees and priests full wages and benefits. The investment accounts that we hold are restricted funds which we cannot touch for operating expenses. The diocesan savings account was over half restricted leaving us with an uncertainty for the 7 months remaining in the 2020 year. The PPP Loan was a blessing for us and those 10 churches who had to curtail pastoral service and still continue to function but with a minimal attendance. As the Diocese of Great Falls-Billings, we strive to find other ways to raise money but must depend mostly on parishioner support. We are most grateful and blessed for our Catholic parishioners in Eastern Montana who continued to support their local churches during this pandemic.



From the Office of the Bishop in regards to Ash Wednesday

(To stay within the guidelines set for physical distancing during Co-Vid)

Distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday: Per a note from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, "The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." "The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything."
