Monsignor House Reflection: Forgiveness and love go hand in hand. In the Gospel message today, our brother, Mark, writes about 3 aspects of what we need to do to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. There is the young man who is having difficulty letting go of great riches, the surprise of the Apostles that someone so rich might have difficulty in entering the Kingdom, and the curiosity of the Apostles on what happens to them when they have so little. They are assured that their salvation is resting in God's decision to save. God sees their devotion and emphasis on carrying out Jesus' mission here on earth. Love and forgiveness are the simple character traits that will make the cut. Our challenge is always: do I forgive those who are different from me and love those whose life experiences are different from my own life? Do I judge or do I pray for those whose lives are lived on the margins of life? Do I let go of my opinions about the poor and seek understanding for their plight? When we love those in need, those who have lived and moved on from the Monsignor House, we honor the mission Jesus came to reveal t us.

Catechism Corner

CATECHISM CORNER

What is the Catholic understanding of "Justification"? (CCC 1987-95)

"The grace of the Holy Spirit has the power to justify us, that is, to cleanse us from sin and to communicate to us the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ and through Baptism" (1987). Our Sacramental life in Christ is a gradual perfecting of ourselves in order that we might partake of the divine life. In this life, we are "justified," which detaches us from sin, accepting God's righteousness by the merits of Christ's Passion (not our own), establishes cooperation between God's grace and man's freedom. Justification is the most excellent work of God's love, manifest in Jesus and granted by the Holy Spirit, the master of the interior life. "But now that you have been freed from sin and have become slaves of God, the benefit that you have leads to sanctification, and its end is eternal life" (Romans 6:22).


