Catechism Corner

CATECHISM CORNER

Are angels real? Do we become angels when we die? (CCC 328-336, 990-1019) In the Creed we profess God to be Creator of "heaven and earth"; "of all things visible and invisible." The angels, though they can be made manifest by God's Will, are pure spiritual beings of the invisible order. As such they have no "corporeal" nature (328). According to St. Augustine 'angel' is the title of their office- servants and messengers of God- while 'spirit' would refer to their nature. Pure spiritual creatures, angels have intelligence and will surpassing in perfection all visible creatures (330). As such, though human's have a spiritual nature as well, we can never become angels, even in heaven, because in the resurrection we will be united once more with our glorified bodies (990). Angels, having been present since creation, bless humanity by their aid and intercession, leading us away from death towards life (336). Our prayers in the Catholic liturgy echo the liturgy of the angels who constantly ferry our prayers to God's High Altar (335).






