
#### Discerning My Gifts—to know

#### **Catechism Corner**

#### **CATECHISM CORNER**

Does the Church still believe in purgatory? (CCC 958, 1030-32) Yes! And we should pray for the dead, "because it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins" (958). From the earliest days of Christianity, we have offered prayers for the dead and treated the faithful departed with honor and respect. Though death is the consequence of sin contrary to God's plan for humanity, the curse of death transformed into our blessing in Christ's passion (1008-1010). The name "Purgatory" is assigned to the final purification of the elect, assured of the promise of heaven, though still imperfect (1030-31). This purification is described as a cleansing fire, referencing 1 Corin. 3:15 and 1 Peter 1:7, and prayer for the dead as an act of charity to relieve them of their sins (2 Maccabees 12:46). Grace that is poured out for many acts of charity can be undertaken on behalf of the dead so that they "may attain the beatific vision of God" (1032), to live in the joyful communion with God forever.



# 'Tis the season for giving!

You have options for supporting the Holy Spirit Parish and School endowments before the end of the year. The giving options on this page could come in handy in a few months when your taxes are due!

#### Keeping it simple: Outright gifts

Put your generosity into action and receive income tax savings with outright giving—even \$5 dollars given to a Hely Spirit endowment will be invested and provide for the parish or school forever. Outright gifts from Montana businesses may qualify for the Montana Endowment Tax Credit!

#### The CARES Act

Benefits for charitable giving in 2021

Not itemizing? Even if you plan to take the standard deduction on your 2021 Federal tax return, you may also claim a one-time, above-the-line "universal deduction" for gifts to charity of up to \$300. Married couples filing jointly can claim up to \$600.

If you plan to itemize deductions: The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions has been temporarily raised. For cash contributions made in 2021, you can now elect to deduct up to 100% of your agus.

Corporate donors have also had their charicable deduction cap raised for 2021—up to 25% of their AGI.

#### Take advantage of the Montana Endowment Tax Credit.

Montana taxpayers who make a planned gift to a one of Holy Spirit's endowments may receive a tax credit equal to 40% of the charitable value of their gift—wow! This is a dollar-for-dollar reduction of the Montana tax you may owe for 2021.

Fundreds of Catholics in Eastern Montana take advantage of this tax credit every year. Foundation President, Judy Held, is happy to help you direct your eligible gift for the everlasting benefit of **Holy Spirit Parish or School**. Reach out to Judy (Information below) to learn more and ensure you receive this Impressive benefit!

You should always consult your own financial advisors before making planned gifts.

Making a tax-free transfer from your IRA is a great way to give while lowering your taxable income. People who are 70 1/2 and older can give up to \$100,000 per year, tax-free, by making a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from their IRA administrator to the Foundation for one of the Holy Spirit endowments.

**Gifts of appreciated stocks and mutual funds** are also quite beneficial. They are an excellent gift, tax-wise, for one of our endowments, whether given outright or to fund a planned gift for the 40% MT Endowment Tax Credit.

Fund a Charitable Gift Annuity and create a new income source for yourself. Lock in great rates and receive excellent tax henef is—best of all, this method of planned giving invests in your future AND the future of our parish and school.
