There is no change in His teaching. We, His followers in 2022, are called to carry the teachings of Jesus through our actions in this world. St. Theresa of Calcutta encouraged those who wanted to be part of her work to return home and care for the poor in their own homes and neighborhoods. We have neighbors living in the Monsignor House and as a parish we encourage and uplift them in their challenges to become independent.

Catechism Corner

CATECHISM CORNER

Did Jesus undo the Law of the Old Testament? (CCC 2052-82) All of the "Law of Moses" is summarized and contained in the "Decalogue" or the "10 Commandments." All of God's covenant with His People Israel are contained and understood through the Law, a manifestation of His Will to the People. The passage of all people from slavery to freedom move through the Law, thus freedom from sin is conformity to God's Will (2061). As fulfillment of all Old Testament promises, Jesus is the manifestation and model of God's Will. He delights in the Decalogue (Matt. 19:16-19) and urges us to obey the Commandments for the perfection of our joy (John 15:10-11). The Decalogue, "since they express man's fundamental duties towards God and towards his neighbor," and are discernable by natural law (through reason) and are revealed by God (through faith) remains gravely obligatory (2072). Rather than view the Decalogue as a restriction on human freedom, we are called to see in them a gift of revelation and adherence is made possible through grace by love for the perfection of joy (2074).

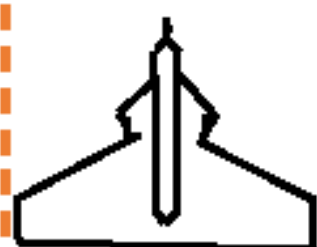
