Catechism Corner

CATECHISM CORNER

Why is coming to Mass so important? (CCC 1066-75) "Liturgy" means "service" to the community. In the context of salvation history it is "participation of the People of God in the work of God" (1069). The Church in the liturgy shares in the priesthood of Christ, which is both prophetic and kingly. Man is sanctified and perfected through the perception of ordinary signs which draw him deeper into the invisible spiritual realities. Each liturgical celebration, it follows, "because it is an action of Christ the priest and of his Body which is the Church, is a sacred action surpassing all others" (1070). The Church itself becomes a visible sign of God's union with man through Christ, giving new life to everyone through "conscious, active, and fruitful participation" (1071). Additionally, liturgy is the source and sum of all Christian prayer (1073), and the proper place of instruction (catechesis) to and through the sacraments, which are the "mystery of Christ" (1074). Proceeding from the visible to the invisible, the liturgy moves the whole, diverse Church from the "sign to that which is signified," the Body of Christ (1075).



Word of Pope Francis at the end of his remarks at the Wednesday General Audience:

My heart aches greatly at the worsening situation in Ukraine. Despite the diplomatic efforts of the last few weeks, increasingly alarming scenarios are opening up. Like me, many people all over the world are feeling anguish and concern. Once again the peace of all is threatened by partisan interests. I would like to appeal to those with political responsibility to examine their consciences seriously before God, who is the God of peace and not of war; who is the Father of all, not just of some, who wants us to be brothers and not enemies. I pray that all the parties involved refrain from any action that would cause even more suffering to the people, destabilizing coexistence between nations and bringing international law into disrepute.

And now I would like to appeal to everyone, believers and non-believers alike. Jesus taught us that the diabolical senselessness of violence is answered with God's weapons, with prayer and fasting. I invite everyone to make next 2 March, Ash Wednesday, a Day of Fasting for Peace. I encourage believers in a special way to dedicate themselves intensely to prayer and fasting on that day. May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war.
