Catechism Corner

What is the Lord's Prayer (Our Father) all about? (CCC 2759-72) In both Matthew and Luke, we receive the story of Jesus teaching the disciples to pray: "When you pray say this" (Matthew 6:9-13, Luke 11:2-4). This prayer which the Master taught us contains within it seven petitions, which we ought to adopt in any and all prayer, and the summary of the whole Gospel (2761). It is the "most perfect of prayers" as we make our request known to God and in the proper sequence of priority (2762). As the prayer comes from Jesus the Master Teacher, and he who models prayer perfectly in his own spiritual devotion, it is rightly called "the Lord's Prayer" (2763). The seven petitions are as follows: "Hallowed be thy name"; "Thy Kingdom come"; "Thy Will be done on Earth..."; Give us this day our daily bread"; "Forgive us... as we forgive..."; "Lead us not into temptation"; "Deliver us from evil." These petitions reflect our confidence in the salvation of Christ, and, therefore, pour forth from our souls with "blessed hope" in our own redemption through the providence of the Father, passion of the Son, and consolation of the Holy Spirit. Now through the Lord's Prayer and its Eucharistic context in liturgy, we "look eagerly for the Lord's return, 'until he comes" (2772).

Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary Basilica of Saint Peter 25 March 2022

O Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, in this time of trial we turn to you. As our Mother, you love us and know us: no concern of our hearts is hidden from you. Mother of mercy, how often we have experienced your watchful care and your peaceful presence! You never cease to guide us to Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Yet we have strayed from that path of peace. We have forgotten the lesson learned from the tragedies of the last century, the sacrifice of the millions who fell in two world wars. We have disregarded the commitments we made as a community of nations. We have betrayed peoples' dreams of peace and the hopes of the young. We grew sick with greed, we thought only of our own nations and their interests, we grew indifferent and caught up in our selfish needs and concerns. We chose to ignore God, to be satisfied with our illusions, to grow arrogant and aggressive, to suppress innocent lives and to stockpile weapons. We stopped being our neighbour's keepers and stewards of our common home. We have ravaged the garden of the earth with war and by our sins we have broken the heart of our heavenly Father, who desires us to be brothers and sisters. We grew indifferent to everyone and everything except ourselves. Now with shame we cry out: Forgive us, Lord!

Holy Mother, amid the misery of our sinfulness, amid our struggles and weaknesses, amid the mystery of iniquity that is evil and war, you remind us that God never abandons us, but continues to look upon us with love, ever ready to forgive us and raise us up to new life. He has given you to us and made your Immaculate Heart a refuge for the Church and for all humanity. By God's gracious will, you are ever with us; even in the most troubled moments of our history, you are there to guide us with tender love.

We now turn to you and knock at the door of your heart. We are your beloved children. In every age you make yourself known to us, calling us to conversion. At this dark hour, help us and grant us your comfort. Say to us once more: "Am I not here, I who am your Mother?" You are able to untie the knots of our hearts and of our times. In you we place our trust. We are confident that, especially in moments of trial, you will not be deaf to our supplication and will come to our aid.

That is what you did at Cana in Galilee, when you interceded with Jesus and he worked the first of his signs. To preserve the joy of the wedding feast, you said to him: "They have no wine" (Jn 2:3). Now, O Mother, repeat those words and that prayer, for in our own day we have run out of the wine of hope, joy has fled, fraternity has faded. We have forgotten our humanity and squandered the gift of peace. We opened our hearts to violence and destructiveness. How greatly we need your maternal help!

Therefore, O Mother, hear our prayer.

Star of the Sea, do not let us be shipwrecked in the tempest of war. Ark of the New Covenant, inspire projects and paths of reconciliation. Queen of Heaven, restore God's peace to the world. Eliminate hatred and the thirst for revenge, and teach us forgiveness. Free us from war, protect our world from the menace of nuclear weapons. Queen of the Rosary, make us realize our need to pray and to love. Queen of the Human Family, show people the path of fraternity. Queen of Peace, obtain peace for our world.

O Mother, may your sorrowful plea stir our hardened hearts. May the tears you shed for us make this valley parched by our hatred blossom anew. Amid the thunder of weapons, may your prayer turn our thoughts to peace. May your maternal touch soothe those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside.

Holy Mother of God, as you stood beneath the cross, Jesus, seeing the disciple at your side, said: "Behold your son" (*In* 19:26). In this way he entrusted each of us to you. To the disciple, and to each of us, he said: "Behold, your Mother" (v. 27). Mother Mary, we now desire to welcome you into our lives and our history. At this hour, a weary and distraught humanity stands with you beneath the cross, needing to entrust itself to you and, through you, to consecrate itself to Christ. The people of Ukraine and Russia, who venerate you with great love, now turn to you, even as your heart beats with compassion for them and for all those peoples decimated by war, hunger, injustice and poverty.

Therefore, Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The "Fiat" that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world.

Through your intercession, may God's mercy be poured out on the earth and the gentle rhythm of peace return to mark our days. Our Lady of the "Fiat", on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the harmony that comes from God. May you, our "living fountain of hope", water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace. Amen.

If you're ready to volunteer or if you would like to hear more about what is expected, we are holding training on Monday, April 4th at 6 PM at Central Christian Church.


Other ways you can be helpful are:

Sister Catherine Kinsella, OP Born into Eternal Life March 3, 2022



Sister Catherine Kinsella of the Dominican Sisters, Sparkill, New York, died on March 3, 2022 in Siena Hall Dominican Convent, Sparkill, NY. She was 89 years old.

Born in St. Louis, MO on January 27, 1933, Catherine was the daughter of Walter and Vera Gallagher Kinsella. She entered the Dominican Congregation of Our Lady of the Rosary in Sparkill on September 8, 1951 and received the name Sister Jean Carol. She professed her first yows in 1953 and final yows in 1958.

Sister Catherine received a BS in Education from Webster University, St. Louis, MO, 1967; an MA in Religious Education from the University of St. Thomas, Houston TX, 1977; and Certification from Aquinas Institute Preaching Institute, St. Louis, MO, 1994.

Sister Catherine's ministries include St. Mary School, Fulton, NY (1953-58); in St. Louis, MO, St. James the Greater School (1958-59 and 1968-70); St. Elizabeth of Hungary School (1959-1967); Epiphany of Our Lord School (1967-1968 and 1973-76); and St. Simon School (1970-73); as Director of Religious Education at St. Joseph Parish (1976-81) and Incarnate Word Parish (1981-85). In 1985 Sister Catherine responded to a call to ministry in the Diocese of Great Falls-Billings Montana. From 1985-90, Sister Catherine was Parish Minister successively at St. Mary's Parish, Malta, MT; St. Mary's Parish, Livingston, MT; and St. Joseph's Parish, Big Timber, MT. She was then appointed as Administrator at St. Joseph's Parish (1990-99). From 1999-2014, Sister Catherine served as a Pastoral Associate at Holy Spirit Parish, Great Falls, MT. She retired in 2014.

Sister Catherine is predeceased by her parents Walter and Vera Gallagher Kinsella; her sister, Sister Ann Kinsella, OP, and her brother John. Sister Catherine is survived by her Niece Susan Woltering (Dennis), her nephew John (Sharon), and her Dominican Sisters and Associates.

Sister Catherine Kinsella made a difference in the lives of countless children, parents, and colleagues in her ministry of education and pastoral ministry in New York, St. Louis, and in Montana. She served her congregation faithfully for 70 years as a Dominican Sister of Sparkill, proclaiming the Word of God through ministry for justice and reverence for all creation. We thank God for Sister Catherine's loving presence and commitment as she is welcomed into the fullness of God's presence. Well done, good and faithful servant, Sister Catherine Kinsella, OP. May you Rest in Peace!
