Catechism Corner

What is the Lord's Prayer (Our Father) all about? (CCC 2759-72) In both Matthew and Luke, we receive the story of Jesus teaching the disciples to pray: "When you pray say this" (Matthew 6:9-13, Luke 11:2-4). This prayer which the Master taught us contains within it seven petitions, which we ought to adopt in any and all prayer, and the summary of the whole Gospel (2761). It is the "most perfect of prayers" as we make our request known to God and in the proper sequence of priority (2762). As the prayer comes from Jesus the Master Teacher, and he who models prayer perfectly in his own spiritual devotion, it is rightly called "the Lord's Prayer" (2763). The seven petitions are as follows: "Hallowed be thy name"; "Thy Kingdom come"; "Thy Will be done on Earth..."; Give us this day our daily bread"; "Forgive us... as we forgive..."; "Lead us not into temptation"; "Deliver us from evil." These petitions reflect our confidence in the salvation of Christ, and, therefore, pour forth from our souls with "blessed hope" in our own redemption through the providence of the Father, passion of the Son, and consolation of the Holy Spirit. Now through the Lord's Prayer and its Eucharistic context in liturgy, we "look eagerly for the Lord's return, 'until he comes" (2772).

The first appearance was on Easter Senday Jost's could have abandomed his Apostles, just as they had abandoned Hittiin the Carden of Georgemants. but He didn't, Instead, Jesus appeared to them and gave. them His peace, His Spirit, and the power to fargive sitts in His ogime

The second visit was for "Doubting" Thomas, who wasn't present for the fest apprairance. Thomas couldn't believe that Jesus was really risen, despite the accounts of eyewithceses.

He demanded physical proof. [esus appeared in the Upper Room and invited "homas to investigate. St.

Thomas, moved to fairly cried out, "My Lord and my Gode" (John-20:28).

This passage reminds us we can always bring. our doubts, fears, and need for forgiveness to Cod, especially on the Sunday after Divine Mercy Smuday. Easter. In the disciples who abandoned

Him, Jasus extended His peace and forgiveness. For St. Thomas who had been struggling with doubt, Joses came in person to strengthen his faith. "Jeaus, Limst in You!"



Why do Catholics display crucifixes?

Catholics display the Crucifia. because it reminds gs of Jesus' sacrifice, His violenty and His love forms

His sacrifice, less 9 willingly sacr fired Himself far as on the Cross. At every Mass, the moment of Jesus' sacrifice is made mystetlously. present again in the sacrifice of the Eucharist in an umbloody manner. The Crucitix indicates that the sacrifice of the Cross and the Mass are one

sacrifice (CCC#1545). His victory. The Crucifix looks like defeat, but in fact, it's a sign of victory. Jesual sacrifice reconciled us with Goo. reopened Heaven to us, and broke the gtip of death. Jesus took on death, sin, and evol, and rose again in triumph.

His level "Creater fore his tal Mills. (han) this, thus a men lay down his life for his friends" (Joleo 15:13). The Crutilia reveals how precious we are to God. Jesus taught as that true love weks the good of the other, lesus pto our good liest. He endored the conditation so we can be with I fim forever in Heaven.
