Catechism Corner

In the Creed, we profess that Jesus suffered, was crucified, died, and was buried. Why did Jesus have to die in this way? (CCC 595-618)

St. John and St. Paul show how our salvation flows from God's initiative of love for us, because "he loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins" (1Jn 4:10). "God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself" (2 Cor 5:19). We also hear Jesus freely offer himself for the salvation of all. During the Last Supper, he made this offering plainly stating: "This is my body which is given for you" (Lk 22:19). The redemption won by Christ consists in this, that he came "to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mt 20:28), that is, he "loved his own to the end" (Jn 13:1), so that they might be "ransomed from the futile ways inherited from their fathers" (1 Pt 1:18). By his loving obedience to the Father, "unto death, even death on a cross" (Phil 2:8), Jesus fulfills the atoning mission (cf. Is 53:10) of the suffering Servant, who will "make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities" (Is 53:11; cf. Rom 5:19). The cross is the unique sacrifice of Christ, the 'one mediator between God and men" (1 Tm 2:5). It is love "to the end" (Jn 13:1) that confers on Christ's sacrifice its value as redemption and reparation. He knew and loved us all when he offered his life. "For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience many will be made righteous." (Jn 17:19, cf. Council of Trent: DS 1752, 1764)
