Reflection: As we celebrated the Ascension and this 7th Sunday of Easter, we are given many memories from our early Church. St Luke writes to Theophilus the background on Jesus rising from the dead, appearing to the Apostles and disciples, ascending into heaven and sending the Holy Spirit. We are continually reminded that He suffered, died, and rose from the grave. We hear this message so many times, throughout our Church life, sometimes we become dulled to the depth of it. We are called to follow the footsteps of Jesus so that we too, might be with him in the Kingdom. The early believers were persecuted and killed over and over because they believed and lived a message that was contrary to the times in which they lived. However, we can have the confidence that whatever we are called to in our life and our times, our Lord has covered us with His love as He prayed: ...the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them." We can be grateful for the early followers of Jesus who passed on to you and me, the message of His faith, His hope, and His love.

Catechism Corner

Next in the Creed, we profess that On the third day He rose again. What does this mean? (CCC 638-655)

'We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus." (Acts 13:32-33) The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of the faith believed and lived as the central truth of the Paschal mystery, along with the cross. The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a real event, verified in the New Testament. "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." (Lk 24:5-6) That empty tomb and the linen cloths was an essential sign for all, signifying that by God's power Christ's body had escaped the bonds of death and corruption. Its discovery by the disciples was the first step toward recognizing the very fact of the Resurrection. Mary Magdalene and the holy women were the first to encounter the Risen One, (Mk 16:1) thus being the first messengers of the Resurrection for the apostles. (Lk 24:9 -10) By means of touch and sharing meals, the risen Jesus establishes direct contact with his disciples. This verifies that the risen body is the same body that had been crucified, bearing the signs of his Passion. (Lk 24: 30, 39-43) This Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life. (CCC 654) This new life is above all justification that reinstates us in God's grace. The Justification consists in victory over the death caused by sin and a new participation in grace. (Cf. Eph 2:4-5) In Christ, Christians' lives are swept up by Christ into the heart of divine life so that they may "live no longer for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised." (2 Cor 5:15)


