





Catechism Corner

Why does the Church attach such high value to good morals? (CCC 1703-1719)

"Living a moral life bears witness to the dignity of the person" (1706). The human creature is the only being in creation God specifically willed for its own sake. Created in the divine image, our bodies are endowed with a spiritual and immortal soul, and our soul yearns for "eternal beatitude" (1703). Participating in the light and power of the Spirit, man recognizes the laws and patterns of nature and builds himself up towards the Creator "in seeking and loving what is true and good" (1704). Though handicapped by original and personal sin, in union with Christ's death and resurrection, man attains the "perfection of charity" through grace which makes him capable of good works (1709). Jesus' core message to humanity, how to live our human lives, is found in the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:3-12), which transcend our temporal existence that we may perceive with the eyes of faith our eternal home (1716). These beatitudes reveal the way of the Christian life: perseverance in suffering, and sustained hope in the promise of Christ, despite one's circumstances, realized in the lives of the saints (1717). Finally, these behaviors point us in the direction of our true hearts' desire-happiness, and more, divine happiness, namely, the beatific vision. The desire of every human heart is toward God: "I seek a happy life, let me seek you so that my soul may live"- St Augustine of Hippo (1718). The Beatitudes are the means towards the divine goal of every human desire (1719).

Praised be Jesus Christ...now and forever...and in all things!

Dear Friends in Christ,

Consecration and the Holy Habit: part 1...We have all been consecrated, or set aside, for God through our Baptism. We belong to Him and to Him alone. We are sacred! What is consecrated cannot be used for the mundane or profane, as it is ordered to the worship of God. Blessed objects, for example, cannot be used as door stops or tossed around. This applies to humans as well. Sin and mistreatment of our bodies profanes what has been rightly ordered for the worship of God and is sacred. Throughout the history of the Church those items set aside for God have been covered, for example: the altar with an altar cloth, the tabernacle with a veil, the chalice with a veil.

As Consecrated Religious we are set aside for God alone in our entirety, and so we, too, are covered is a particular way that speaks to the sacredness of our commitment. Our manner of covering is our Holy Habit. For us it is a wedding gown worn at all times. Each piece of the habit holds a special significance, and a particular prayer is said while putting it on. This week let us each ponder our own consecration and how we manifest our sacredness to the world.


The Holy Eucharist and the Domestic Church
