Catechism Corner

I have to follow the Commandments? (CCC 2052-2055)

God is the source of all goodness, and goodness itself (2052). As giver of the Law (Ex. 20:2-17), God's Law is a good gift given to humanity to live a good life. Our concupiscence, the nagging side effect of original sin, corrupts our hearts to view the Commandments as a restriction on our free will rather than an escape from the slavery of sin. The Commandments are not removed as a condition of discipleship, but Christ illuminates their meaning by highlighting the theological virtue of love as the key to understanding the deeper meaning: "love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart and with thy whole soul and with thy whole mind...love thy neighbor as thyself' (Mt. 22:37,39) (2055). The key of love internalizes the meanings of each Commandment, revealing the thoughts of the heart, as well as our actions, as culpable of sin as well. Throughout the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 5-7), Jesus fulfills the Law of Love by the pattern of "You have heard... But I say to you" both affirming His Divine Eminence and demanding loving hearts (2054). This supersession of the Law is seen as blasphemy by the Pharisees, but Jesus as Divine Logos proclaims the preeminence of love as the key to our salvation. St. Paul, a redeemed Pharisee, picks up on this theme as well as he writes to the Romans: "'You shall not commit adultery; you shall not kill; you shall not steal; you shall not covet,' and whatever other commandment there may be, are summed up in this saying, namely 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law" (13:9-10).




